

How to build a hedgehog home

You will need:

Plastic or polystyrene storage box, knife or scissors, water resistant paint, paint brush, twigs, dry leaves and a brick. It is estimated that there were over 30 million hedgehogs in the UK in the 1950s. But recent estimates suggest there are less than a million left. Which is a shame as hedgehogs are a gardeners friend as they love to eat pests such as slugs, beetles and caterpillars and just like you they need a home to find shelter in. Placing your hedgehog home outside during spring or summer means it will be ready when they're house-hunting in autumn.





Step 1: Get a large plastic or polystyrene storage box.



Step 3: Paint your box to help it camouflage in the garden. Make sure to use water resistant paint.



Step 2: Using a knife or scissors, cut an entrance in the box. Young people will need an adult helper to assist them. If you are using a plastic box cover any sharp edges with masking tape.



Step 4: Tuck the box under or near a hedge, facing south if possible. Place a brick on top of the hedgehog home to weigh it down. You can add leaves and twigs inside the box to encourage a hedge-hog to set up home.
