How to build an animal friendly log pile

In woodlands, dead and decaying wood is natural and abundant. It provides an important habitat for lots of wildlife within this ecosystem. Log piles mimic fallen trees

which provides a home and a source of food for many animals. Within a year or two, a wildlife community can be in and around a log pile.



Step 1: Gather some logs. All shapes and sizes—off cuts are perfect for this!



Step 2: Find a nice shaded spot in your garden and pile up your logs. This can be done in a nice neat pile or all higgledy piggedy. You can place dry leaves, grass cuttings, or straw in any gaps. This is now the perfect place for any small creature to make a home over the winter.

Be sure to compost these materials once they need replacing
