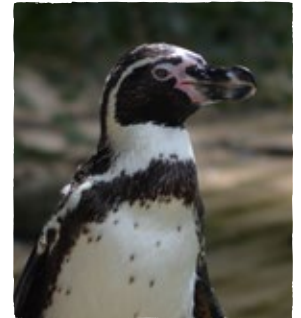


# KS1 Lesson Plan: Wildlife Heroes

## HUMBOLT PENGUIN

At Twycross Zoo we have a colony of Humboldt penguins. In the wild they are found in Chile and Peru in South America. This species is classed as 'vulnerable'. This means they are likely to become endangered. One of the biggest problems they face is overfishing. Humans catch a lot of fish from the ocean, which means that it is hard for the penguins to find enough fish to eat themselves.

If you look out for the logo below when you buy fish products such as fish fingers, you are helping penguins. That logo means that fish is 'sustainable', meaning we haven't taken too much from the ocean.



Another problem that penguins and other marine animals face is plastic. When our plastic rubbish such as food packaging and plastic bottles washes in to the ocean, animals can get trapped in it, and even eat it by mistake.

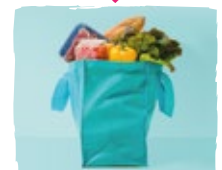
## TOP TIP
